European Renewable Gas Registry

ERGaR aims at becoming the Europe-wide recognised organisation for administering and mass balancing volumes of biomethane virtually distributed along the European natural gas network.

The injected biomethane is blended with natural gas in the pipelines of the natural gas grid and the methane molecules of fossil and renewable origin cannot be differentiated. The operation of a mass balance system enables monetising the intrinsic ("bio") value of exported biomethane without explicitly tracking the physical cross-border movements.
